FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

Today marked the 10th Sunday after Pentecost.

I thought once again about the alternative name for this time in the life of the Church. This "other" name for the Sundays after Pentecost is "Ordinary Time". What things go on during "Ordinary Time" in our lives?

Well, you name it, and it probably would fall under the heading of "Ordinary Time", cooking, cleaning, sleeping, TV watching, following friends and acquaintances on Facebook, working out, gardening, reading, laundry, vacation time and the list could go far into the mind's imagination. In the readings for Worship this 1st day of a new week, Jesus involves his disciples in the ministry of teaching and feeding the hungry. With great skill, the writer of St. John's Gospel painted a picture of God in Christ Jesus feeding the hungry crowd with the slightest amount of bread among. Thousands were gathered to hear what this itinerant Rabbi had to say about God's interest in and presence with his creation. The Large number of people following Jesus aside, what our worshipping community witnessed was the ordinariness of the people seeking good news.

Throughout the past months of the Summer Season in the USA, we listen for good news about the weather, inflation and the movement—up and down—in the pricing of goods and services. And of course we hope for good news regarding the various venues for sport, entertainment and matters of governing in the world God has placed us in. Our lives are filled with the ordinariness of the everyday, and the intricate interwovenness of what happens that links humans with one another in the ordinary.

After worship yesterday, July 27, 2024, Becky told me that she met the new neighbors who moved into the house behind us here in Harvard. The young couple shared that they had moved to Harvard the week before last from their previous place in McHenry. Somehow the topic of Becky's husband being at work came up. The young neighbor, asked what Becky's husband did for a living. She answered that he was a Lutheran pastor. "Where?" the young man asked. Right now, Becky answered, "he is assigned to Shepherd of the Hills on Green Street in McHenry." He said, "I know right where that is." There it is, a thread of connectedness discovered over the back fence. That seems to verify the appropriateness of "Ordinary Time" for the Time after Pentecost.

What comes to mind for you during the "Ordinary Time" of your life as a Disciple of Jesus? How does the Spirit of God seem to show up in the midst of the "Ordinary?" It could be that somehow the opening will appear for you to let someone know that you follow Jesus with some pretty ordinary people at SOTH. It could happen that they might know right where that is, and you can invite them to discover a place that would be a good place for them find Jesus among the ordinary folks at a pretty extraordinary community of Jesus' sisters and brothers.

As "Ordinary Time" continues we can offer a safe place to take a break from the ordinary of the times upcoming.

As I noted this weekend, "It's just a thought."






Nine youth and three adults joined me on the adventure of a lifetime as we went to

Report on the Northern Illinois Synod Assembly

Thank you for allowing me to represent our church at the Annual meeting of the Northern Illinois Synod Assembly on June 14 & 15, 2024. There were 195 lay voting members and 95 rostered voting members totaling 290. The agenda was voted on and accepted. Report from LSSI - 50,991 people helped in the past year, included project lead prevention of alcohol and drug use. 1447 people helped in affordable

housing. 2607 children were transitioned from foster care service to adoption.

We adopted compensation guidelines for rostered ministers for 2025. The treasurers budget report proposed for 2026 (starts in February 2025 to January 2026) was passed.

We had a guest military chaplain who explained that ELCA Chaplains are the only unrestricted ministers. All other denominations have restrictions on how and who they can help. Bishop Fidlar reported she has visited 82% of congregations in NIS.

There is a fund for International Partnerships in honor of former Bishop Clements. Our synod is partnered with Tanzania and going to be partnered with India soon. World Hunger Association is celebrating 50 years.

Our key note speaker, Pastor Miguel talked on mission development. Evangelism is not optional. We should talk to people about our faith so we can grow. Our job is "to plant the seed". John 4:1-42 talks about the woman at the well and how she came to Jesus. She later went back to town to tell them about Jesus and they believed. We should be talking to people about our faith, not just inviting them to our church. Be prepared to welcome others. Where are our potential wells? Who are the Samaritan women? Is our congregation ready to welcome people? What is the first step we will take?

Pastor Miguel showed a video of Bishop Eaton for church wide synod congregations. This is available on NIS website along with other parts of the synod meeting.

The meeting is interesting and important, as the first time I attended and Bishop Clements was retiring. I was able to vote on the new Bishop. I encourage others to attend the meeting next year.


