#### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Fellow Disciples at Shepherd of the Hills,

I have missed celebrating Advent with you this year.

Advent is a season of hope and waiting. That is clear in the Gospel accounts of Mary, Joseph and their community as they waited and hoped for Mary to deliver her first born child. That was a different kind of hope and waiting than was customary for the people of Nazareth. That has been my experience of hope and waiting this year's Advent season for me.

Ist off, my hope is a hope for a successful healing of the surgical wound. Yesterday the surgeon rescheduled my follow-up evaluation of the wound healing. He was not able to give me a fully positive report. Unfortunately, his report was one of cautious direction. He said that additional wound healing time is necessary to avoid the danger of infection. That additional time would, he said, require me to navigate the next 2 weeks with as little activity as possible. Translated, that means staying immobile most of the time. I had hoped for a better report.

I wonder if that might be a situation not unlike the way the Jewish people felt in their waiting and hoping for appearance of Messiah.

As we approach the 4th weekend of Advent, Christmas Eve and Christmas day, I suspect that Mary and Joseph's lives—complicated by the Emperor's command that everyone return to their ancestral home for the first census taken across the Roman Empire—involved a journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem. They were no doubt weary and uncomfortable as they made that journey. They too would receive news they weren't counting on.

Because, lo and behold the time came for Mary to deliver her first-born child. The arrival of the child was in a place and condition for which they could not have planned.

Well, I'm so grateful for the support, caring and prayers you have given to Becky and me. AND I've been looking forward to celebrating this season with all of you. We will do that, but not as I was hoping it would be.

In light of the doctor's direction that my standing and walking be substantially curtailed we will be sharing Christmas worship with my presiding from a seated position. Not quite that for which I had hoped and waited. Nonetheless we will be together in celebrating the birth of our Lord and savior.







#### Q1 What keeps you coming to SOTH? (Mark all that apply)






#### Q3 Where do you believe SOTH can improve? (mark all that apply)




