FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Fellow Disciples at Shepherd of the Hills,

Yesterday was the 2nd week of Lent, the first of SOTH's Wednesdays of Lent.

The disciples of Jesus who gathered for this day, joined me in considering one of the Opportunities Mid-Week Worship provides for Spiritual development.

The hymn for the day was "I Wonder as I Wander" which became the opportunity to consider one of the questions that comes to mind—often unbidden—as we wander through the days of our lives. Yesterday we considered the commandment that Jesus identified as the First and Greatest Commandment, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart mind and spirit" and a 2nd Commandment which is like it "Love your Neighbor as yourself."

A question that we often ask in our wondering is Why did this happen? Often that can become Why did you do this to me, my family, my friend etc.? The wondering that is directed toward the Lord our God whom we are to love with our entire being. This is a profound question, a puzzling question, and a question for which we seek an answer.

The answer one finds to this question can seriously alter one's relationship with the God of our faith. If our Heavenly Father does bring hurtful things to us, how then do we direct all encompassing love toward that God? A couple of answers to this question were offered.

One suggested answer to our 'why' was, "instead of asking Why did this come to me, one might ask, "Why Not Me"? That is an opened ended question that can lead to a broader view of a painful situation. Another suggestion was to approach the present issue from the stance that Our Heavenly Father is not the author or bringer of whatever difficulty that has befallen us, but is rather a God who suffers with us, stands by us, and does answer our wondering with Spiritual Wisdom beyond all human understanding. While the Father/Mother is not the author of hurt, our Heavenly Parent can and will not leave a negative a negative, but is able to work even the worst for good.

How can that be? Yes that is a further wondering.

During the weeks of Lent let's give ourselves the opportunity to wander a little and wonder some as we do so.

At the remaining Mid-Week worship opportunities, you are invited to anonymously offer a personal wondering to be lifted up and shared. In the sharing we will listen for the Spirit's wisdom as we hear some of Jesus' teachings.

We are grateful to all who participated in the Shepherd of the Hills Pastoral Call Questionnaire.

Three of the questions that were asked of the congregation from the call committee to help them complete the ministry site profile offered the opportunity for members to share individual concerns, suggestions, and perceptions on specific topics. Below you will find the most common themes captured from the data for question #9

Question #9 – List any obstacles, you think, a new pastor might experience at Shepherd of the Hills.

By far the theme that had the most responses was that of members worrying about people being generally resistant to change. There were many comments on the fondness members held for past or present pastors, Pastor Roger Schneider, Pastor Tom Rogers and Pastor Rob Kinnear. Many commented on the need for a new pastor to rapidly connect with members before and after services by being himself and quickly establishing loyalty and trust with members.

Another theme with several responses centered around the decline in church membership and the lower than desired attendance at the worship services. Fallout from the Covid pandemic, the length of time without a permanent pastor, a remote option for worship service or alternate online options and societal priorities were listed as obstacles that a new pastor and the church will need to overcome to regrow the congregation. A challenging task for a new pastor will be striking a balance of pleasing both current membership and attracting new membership as well as pleasing all age groups associated with our church. A shared perception was that the attendees at the three different worship services were like having three separate congregations. Several comments were made about the need to rebuild our youth program, including the confirmation program, and engaging the youth by having them participate in the services again as acolytes.

The last theme where several members showed shared concern was that of a new pastor being spread too thin to accomplish the tasks expected of him with not enough volunteer support from the congregation.

Again, the call committee appreciates everyone's input which has helped us greatly with our task of completing the ministry site profile.

Three of the questions that were asked of the congregation from the call committee to help them complete the ministry site profile offered the opportunity for members to share individual concerns, suggestions, and perceptions on specific topics. Below you will find the most common themes captured from the data for question #10.

Question #10 – What is the number one thing you want in a new pastor?

By far, the top two responses to the above question were first, have a new pastor that was able to interact with all people and different age groups by showing kindness and understanding and making all feel welcome; and second, being relatable and able to apply scripture to everyday life through a good sermon that will carry people through the week.

Another theme was someone who is able to keep the congregation energized and excited to serve the lord. Someone who has the energy and stamina to recruit new members especially young families and that can teach the word of the lord to both young and old. Someone who is very knowledgeable about bible scripture.

Other descriptive characteristics that were mentioned were: charismatic, dynamic, a good administrator, someone who shows love, someone who is youthful, someone who is trustworthy and committed to Shepherd of the Hills, someone with traditional values with an open mind to the future, and someone who is able to combine old and new methods for the best outcome.

Again, thank you to all who participated in the questionnaire. It was a tremendous help to the call committee in completing the ministry site profile required by the synod as we go forward in the search for a permanent pastor at Shepherd of the Hills.

The Pastoral Call Committee has completed the final version of the Ministry Site Profile. The document has been submitted to the Church Council for approval on February 22nd. Once the Church Council has approved it, the Pastoral Call Committee will then submit the MSP to the Northern Illinois Synod for their approval and online activation.



Good Friday Music - by Randy Casey



On Good Friday, March 29th, the Shepherd of the Hills choir will be pleased to present a work for choir and organ entitled **A Service of Darkness** by American composer Dale Wood (1934-2003). The subtitle of this piece is "Seven Choral Meditations on the Last Words of Christ," making this an appropriate offering on this most somber day of the liturgical year. The choir has been rehearsing on this work since last summer and we would be delighted for you to come and hear the fruits of our labor.

I will be playing the organ for the **Service of Darkness** and we will have a guest conductor by the name of Steve Szalaj. Steve is the conductor of a community chorus in Crystal Lake and I have been the accompanist for his group for the past 23 years. I am more than happy to vouch for Steve's musicianship and for the positive spirit he will bring to leading the singers.

The congregation will be given the simple and straightforward words for you to follow along as we sing. And although it may look like a lot of words, the truth is that the piece only lasts between 20 and 25 minutes. There is actually a suggested order of service given in the front of the music score to provide a possible format for this choral presentation.

The music of Lent and especially of Good Friday is powerful and can be even emotional because humanity understands suffering all too well. One of the greatest choral works ever composed, the Passion According to St. Matthew, was for the service on Good Friday of 1727 at St. Thomas Church of Leipzig by Johann Sebastian Bach. Both of Bach's parents died when he was 9 years old, to illustrate only one reason why this greatest of all composers of sacred music was able to portray the plight of the suffering Jesus so well.

Although your church choir has enjoyed some rewarding moments over the past several months, this **Service of Darkness** by Dale Wood will be the pinnacle of our achievement until, frankly, next Good Friday. Try beginning a family tradition this year of experiencing the finest music your church choir has to offer at the end of Holy Week, March 29th.

In closing I will just say that it is a pleasure for me to work with singers in your church choir. They have sung every piece I have handed them, even though I have stretched them to musical limits they did not know were possible. Our rehearsals are fast-paced and a bit intense and people leave smiling. If you would like to add an unexpected spark to your routine, please feel free to join us.

In the meantime, let us have a blessed Holy Week together. In the meantime, we hope to see you on Good Friday.
