"In The Bleak Midwinter" by Randy Casey

The tune and text constituting the carol "In the Bleak Midwinter" will be seen in two different guises during Epiphany at Shepherd of the Hills. Its initial appearance will be on a Sunday morning in January as the congregation sings hymn #294. The choir will then sing an arrangement of this melody on the first Sunday in February.

Easily the most memorable aspect of "In the Bleak Midwinter" is its third verse: "What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a wise man I would do my part. Yet what I can I give Him---give Him my heart." These sensitive words were penned by the English poetess Christina Rossetti (1830 - 1894) who also wrote, by the way, the Christmas poem "Love Came Down At Christmas." What Rossetti accomplishes in this third verse of "In the bleak midwinter" is that of making us a part of the Christmas story. In reading the final line of the verse we learn that we too, like the shepherd and Wise Men, have something to offer the Christ child.

As yet, as beautiful as all the verses of "In the Bleak Midwinter" are, they would not be so well known were they not set to music so exquisitely by the English composer Gustav Holst (1874 - 1934). One sees that the poet's and the composer's lives overlapped by 20 years and lived in the same not large country, raising the question of whether they ever met. Frankly, I have no idea, but a more germane question might be to wonder how and when Gustav Holst found the poem at all. Did he discover it in some book he was randomly perusing?. Or did his friend and colleague Ralph Vaughn Williams (1872 - 1958) know the poem and suggest it to him as a musical possibility. We will probably never know, but the fact remains that this text and tune combination is nothing short of a masterpiece.

One might wonder why we are singing "In the Bleak Midwinter" during Epiphany since it is actually in the Christmas section of the ELW. Because there are technically only two Sundays in the Christmas season, we normally sing the more jubilant and well-known carols such as "Joy To The World" and/or "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing!" during that short season of celebration. Of course, we also sing "Silent Night," which, come to think of it, one could deem a more popular, older sibling of sorts to "In the Bleak Midwinter."

"In the Bleak Midwinter" is an amalgam of lovely poetry and simple music that rather subtly attracts our attention. We hear its message during Epiphany and realize that its meaning dwells within us all year round.

It's like the "what's going on part" of the Worship Folder, so the 10am peeps can get those dates in their calendars as well.

- Repaired defective lighting in the Sanctuary
- Added a relay link between the fire panel and the security system
- Repaired HVAC unit on the Roof
- Managed the loss of electrical feed to our church and subsequent damage done as a result.
- Renovated the Bathrooms in the Head Start Area
- Constructed the Audio-Visual booth in the rear of the sanctuary.
- Relocated the Youth Room to the main floor allowing Head Start to expand into that area.
